### **Our Commitment to Child Safety Includes:**

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## **St Albans Netball Club (SNC) Player Participation Philosophy**

This policy aligns with SNC's commitment to player development, team success, and creating a positive and inclusive environment for all participants.

### **Participation Philosophy**

At St Albans Netball Club (SNC), our player participation philosophy is centred around promoting skill development, teamwork, and a love for the game. We believe that providing equal opportunities for players to explore different positions in their formative years is essential to fostering well-rounded athletes. As players progress through the age groups, SNC's approach becomes more team-oriented, ensuring that every player contributes to the team's success in a position that benefits the collective effort.

### **Participation Guidelines**

#### **1. Foundation Program (Net Set Go)**

- Our Net Set Go program serves as the foundation of our player development pathway, targeting our youngest participants and introducing them to the basics of netball. Net Set Go is specifically designed for children aged 5-10, providing them with a fun, safe, and inclusive environment where they can learn the fundamental skills of netball while building confidence, coordination, and a love for the game. This program is critical in fostering an early interest in netball and setting the stage for future growth as players transition into our Under 9s and Under 11s teams.

#### **1. Development Age Groups (Under 9s to Under 11s)**

- **Exposure to Multiple Positions:** In the younger age groups, SNC will encourage players to experience different positions on the court. This exposure helps players develop a broad range of skills and a deeper understanding of the game.
- **Fair Playing Time:** All players will receive a minimum of two quarters of play during home and away matches, ensuring that each individual has the chance to participate and grow.
- **Team Learning Environment:** These age groups will focus on learning, development, and fostering a supportive, inclusive environment where all players have opportunities to try new positions without the pressure of specialising too early.

#### **2. Competitive Age Groups (Under 13s and above)**

- **Position Specialisation:** As players move into the older age groups, SNC will place participants in positions that best suit their abilities and the needs of the team. This approach ensures that players excel in their specialised roles and contribute to the overall success of the team.

- **Adaptable Pathways for Older Participants:** Older participants who join at a later age will be provided with adaptable pathways to develop the necessary skills to compete. If required, they will have the option to train with their appropriate age team to build their skills without any financial contribution required. As these players develop, they will be given the opportunity to partake in 2-3 games before officially joining the team, allowing them to adjust and find their place within the club without pressure or cost.
- **Team-Focused Play:** While individual growth remains important, the priority in these age groups is on achieving the best possible team outcomes. Players will be assigned positions that enhance the team's performance as a whole.

### 3. Finals Matches (All Age Groups)

- **Team-First Approach:** During finals, SNC's primary objective is to achieve the best possible outcome for the team. Therefore, players will be assigned to positions that benefit the team, even if this differs from their regular positions during the season. This strategy will help the team compete at its highest potential during important matches.

### Key Objectives

- To develop versatile, well-rounded players in the foundational age groups by providing opportunities to experience multiple positions and introducing younger players to netball through the Net Set Go program.
- To provide adaptable pathways for older participants joining at a later stage, offering training and game experience without financial barriers to support their integration into the club.
- To shift focus towards team-oriented play as participants progress through the age groups, prioritising the success of the team over individual preferences.
- To ensure fair and consistent playing time for all participants in the younger age groups, fostering enjoyment and engagement with the sport.
- To maximise team success in finals by assigning players to positions that align with the team's strategy and goals.

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## St Albans Netball Club (SNC) Coaching Philosophy

This coaching philosophy reflects SNC's commitment to providing a high-quality, player-centred coaching experience that helps athletes thrive both on the court and in their broader lives.

### Coaching Philosophy

At St Albans Netball Club (SNC), our coaching philosophy is built upon the principles of growth, teamwork, and holistic player development. We believe that every player, regardless of their skill level, deserves the opportunity to improve, be challenged, and contribute to the team. Our approach emphasises personal growth, while maintaining a strong focus on fostering a positive team culture.

Coaches who live out the following core principles will be appointed to their position for one year and must re-apply each year, adhering to the SNC Committee's merit and equity selection process.

### Core Principles

### **1. Player Development First**

- At SNC, we are committed to the long-term development of each player. Our coaches focus on building both foundational skills and advanced techniques, with an emphasis on continual improvement. We believe in providing players with the tools they need to grow not only as athletes but also as individuals, both on and off the court.

- We recognise that netball is more than just a game—it's an opportunity to develop life skills. Our coaching promotes values such as resilience, leadership, respect, and accountability. By instilling these qualities, we aim to help players become well-rounded individuals who contribute positively to their communities.

- While we value individual development, our coaching approach places significant importance on teamwork. Every player is part of something bigger than themselves, and we foster a culture where collaboration, communication, and mutual respect are key. Winning is important, but we believe that how we achieve success—through effort, sportsmanship, and unity—matters even more.

### **4. Inclusive and Positive Environment**

### **Spectator Philosophy**

At St Albans Netball Club (SNC), we recognise that our spectators are an essential part of creating a positive, supportive, and welcoming environment for all participants. Our philosophy is based on the values of respect, encouragement, and sportsmanship, and we strive to uphold the highest standards of behaviour. As a club, we operate within the guidelines and expectations set by the St Albans / Caroline Springs Netball Association, Netball Victoria, and the Australian Sports Commission, ensuring that we align with best practices for fostering an inclusive and respectful sporting environment.

### **Core Principles**

#### **1. Support for Coaches and Players**

- Our spectators play a key role in supporting the growth and development of players and coaches. By cheering positively and constructively, spectators help create an environment where everyone can perform at their best. Whether our team is succeeding or facing challenges, we encourage all spectators to uplift our participants through encouragement and positivity.
- The support of our spectators allows our coaches and players to focus on improving their skills, building confidence, and enjoying the game.

#### **2. Creating a Fun and Welcoming Atmosphere**

- SNC is committed to creating a fun and inclusive environment for everyone, both on and off the court. Spectators are encouraged to cheer for our teams in a way that reflects sportsmanship and respect for all participants.
- We welcome families, friends, and community members to join us in creating a sense of belonging, where everyone feels valued and included, regardless of the match outcome.

#### **3. Respect for Referees and Umpires**

- Referees and umpires are critical to the success of our games, ensuring that the matches are played fairly and safely. While there may be instances where spectators do not agree with certain decisions, it is essential to respect that referees are doing their best to officiate the game.
- As a club, we ask that spectators remember the importance of these officials to the game and demonstrate respect at all times. Without their contributions, our teams cannot participate, and their role is vital to maintaining the integrity of the game.

#### **4. Operating Within Governing Guidelines**

- SNC is committed to upholding the guidelines and expectations established by the St Albans / Caroline Springs Netball Association, Netball Victoria, and the Australian Sports Commission. Our club and spectators are expected to adhere to the principles of fair play, respect, and good sportsmanship as outlined by these governing bodies.

- By aligning with these standards, we ensure that SNC fosters an environment of integrity, inclusiveness, and respect for all involved.

### **Expectations for Spectators**

- Cheer enthusiastically and positively for all players, regardless of the score or outcome.
- Support coaches in their efforts to develop players, showing appreciation for their dedication.
- Promote sportsmanship by modelling respectful behaviour towards opposing teams, referees, and other spectators.
- Refrain from negative or critical remarks directed at players, coaches, referees, or other spectators.
- Help maintain an enjoyable and inclusive atmosphere that reflects the values of SNC, Netball Victoria, and the Australian Sports Commission.

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## **St Albans Netball Club Player Club Registration and Fees**

**Junior competitors from Under 9s to Under 18s:** Fees are calculated to include each player's portion of the team registration fee for the season and the game day fees for each round. These combined costs ensure all club and competition expenses are fairly distributed and covered for the entire season.

**Senior and open competition players:** Fees are paid weekly on game day. In Round 1, all players must contribute equally to the team's registration fee in addition to their game day fee, ensuring the team's place in the competition is confirmed.

### **Terms and Conditions**

#### **1. Fee Payment Requirements**

- All junior player registration fees are to be paid in full prior to the commencement of the season.
- For junior players joining partway through the season, fees must be paid before the round in which they begin playing, and will be calculated on a pro-rata basis, inclusive of team registration and game-day costs.

#### **2. Refund Policy – Withdrawal or Injury**

- Player fees are non-refundable once the season has commenced, unless:
  - a) The player withdraws due to injury or extenuating circumstances; and
  - b) A replacement player is found to fill the vacancy for the remaining rounds.
- If a refund is approved, the following deductions will apply:
  - Team registration fee (non-refundable)
  - Pro-rata cost of rounds already played or scheduled prior to the replacement player's start
  - Any applicable administrative or processing costs

- If no replacement player is found, no refund will be issued.
3. Refund Process and Approvals
    - Refunds must be formally requested in writing to the committee.
    - Requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis and are subject to committee approval.
    - If approved, the refund will be processed within 30 days or may be transferred as a credit towards the next playing season.
  4. Injury Submissions
    - A medical certificate may be required to support refund requests due to injury.
    - Refunds or credits will only be considered if the injury prevents a player from participating in three or more consecutive rounds.
  5. Team Impact Consideration
    - Refunds will not be granted if it would result in the team falling below the minimum player requirement needed to continue participating in the competition.
  6. Exceptional Circumstances
    - The committee reserves the right to consider exceptional personal or family circumstances and may grant refunds or credits at their discretion.
  7. Outstanding Debts
    - Refunds will not be issued if the player has any outstanding debts to St Albans Netball Club, including unpaid uniform costs or other club-related expenses.
    - All amounts owing must be settled prior to a refund being processed or considered.
  8. Non-Payment of Fees by Round Five (Juniors)
    - If a junior player has not paid their registration fees in full by Round 5, they will not be permitted to take the court until:
      - a) Full payment has been made; or
      - b) An official payment arrangement has been made and approved by the Club Treasurer.
    - If a payment plan is in place but not up to date, the player will be ineligible to play that week until the payment schedule is back on track.

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## St Albans Netball Club Uniform Guidelines

At St Albans Netball Club, our uniform is an important aspect of our identity and helps foster a sense of belonging among members. In adhering to these uniform guidelines, we reinforce our club's values of teamwork, identity, and safety, creating a positive environment for all members.

- **Game Day Uniform:** Players are required to wear the official game day uniform during all structured competitions. This ensures a cohesive team appearance and promotes club spirit.

- **Coaching Attire:** Coaches are expected to wear club colours while coaching. This not only helps distinguish their role and responsibilities but also aligns with our child safety requirements, making it clear to all members who they can approach for support and guidance.
- **Additional Uniform Items:** Extra club uniform items, such as training tops, polos, hoodies, and bags, are available for purchase through our uniform shop. These items allow members to show their club pride while providing comfortable and appropriate attire for training sessions and other activities.

Club uniform can be purchased on training days or by contacting one of our committee members.

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## **St Albans Netball Club Training Session Structure**

A well-structured training session is essential for player development, improving fitness, and enhancing game understanding. At St Albans Netball Club, our training and fitness sessions are tailored to balance overall team growth with individual player development, ensuring both collective performance and personal progress are emphasised. Each session focuses on physical fitness, ball control, and strategic play. Below is our typical training session structure:

### **1. Warm-Up (10-15 minutes)**

- Light jogging, dynamic stretching, and netball-specific movements.
- Activation drills for footwork and reflexes.

### **2. Fitness and Ball Control (20-25 minutes)**

- Fitness circuit: agility drills, short sprints, and bodyweight exercises.
- Ball control drills: passing and catching, reaction drills, and defence practice.
- Fitness and ball control will be tailored to balance overall team growth and individual player development.

### **3. Game Simulation (20-25 minutes)**

- Set play drills focusing on attack, defence, and positioning.
- Small-sided games to improve decision-making and teamwork.

### **4. Game Sense (15-20 minutes)**

- Tactical scenarios to develop strategic thinking.
- Team feedback and reflection on decision-making and game execution.

### **5. Cool Down (5-10 minutes)**

- Light jog, static stretching, and team reflection.
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## Sport and Netball Victoria Code of Conduct

### Fair Play Code

The Fair Play Code outlines the standards of behaviour expected by everyone involved in sport in Victoria. Organisations and Clubs must ensure the standards of the Fair Play Code are applied by demonstrating the five core values that will lead to fair play for all: Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness and Safety.

### General Code of Behaviour

As a member of the St Albans Netball Club, affiliated with Netball Victoria, all participants, including players, coaches, officials, parents/guardians, and spectators, are required to adhere to the following [Netball Victoria Code of Conduct](#):

- Respect the rights, dignity, and worth of every person, regardless of their background, gender, or ability.
- Be fair, honest, and considerate in all interactions with others.
- Accept personal responsibility for your actions and maintain a professional demeanour.
- Commit to providing and participating in quality services and activities.
- Abide by all rules, regulations, and policies set by Netball Victoria and St Albans Netball Club.
- Do not exploit your role within the Club to promote personal beliefs that conflict with the Club's values.
- Demonstrate a high standard of behaviour, particularly when working with persons under 18.
- Avoid situations where minors are left unaccompanied.
- Ensure that your actions and words do not bring the Club into disrepute.
- Provide a safe environment and show concern for those who may be unwell or injured.
- Act as a positive role model at all times.
- Understand the consequences of breaching this Code of Behaviour, including disciplinary actions.

### **Junior Player Code of Behaviour**

In addition to the General Code of Behaviour, junior players are expected to:

- Participate for enjoyment, not solely to satisfy others' expectations.
- Learn and play by the rules in a fair and safe manner.
- Accept decisions made by umpires without argument.
- Cooperate with coaches and teammates, and respect all players on and off the court.
- Avoid behaviours such as verbal abuse, intentional fouls, and damage to property.
- Be punctual, responsible, and respectful of your team's efforts.
- Do not engage in harmful practices, including drug and alcohol use.
- Appreciate the contributions of volunteers and staff who facilitate the opportunity to play.

### **Senior Player Code of Behaviour**

In addition to the General Code of Behaviour, senior players are expected to:

- Respect the rights, dignity, and worth of fellow players, coaches, and officials.
- Avoid behaviours that may be seen as harassment or discrimination.
- Take care of uniforms and equipment and be honest with coaches about injuries or illnesses.
- Maintain discipline, punctuality, and a positive attitude both during training and games.
- Abide by the rules, respect the umpire's decisions, and clarify any doubts respectfully.
- Refrain from using substances that could affect sporting performance, including alcohol, tobacco, and drugs.

### **Parent/Guardian Code of Behaviour**

Parents and guardians must:

- Encourage children to participate for their enjoyment and not impose undue pressure to perform.
- Emphasise effort and personal improvement over winning.
- Lead by example, promoting good sportsmanship, and never ridiculing mistakes or losses.
- Communicate respectfully with officials, coaches, and other parents/guardians, raising concerns through proper channels.
- Value and support the work of volunteers and staff, and demonstrate respect for their contributions to the Club.

### **Spectator Code of Behaviour**

Spectators are expected to:

- Support all players, not just their own, and applaud good performances from both teams.
- Respect the decisions made by coaches and umpires, and avoid questioning them publicly.
- Refrain from ridiculing or criticising players, coaches, or umpires during or after games.
- Condemn any form of violence or abuse in the sport and promote a positive, supportive environment.
- Learn the rules of netball to better appreciate and understand the game.

## Process for Providing Constructive Feedback

This process ensures all members' voices are heard, and feedback is handled respectfully and efficiently.
